Series Reflections:

Well the fishing is over so let the bragging begin! The finish of the 2010 SC Governor's Cup Billfishing Series was one for the record books with two boats only 200 points apart coming into the final tournament. Caramba had fished in all four of the previous tournaments throughout the summer, and accumulated a total of 3,275 release points going into Edisto. Daymaker, which had fished three Series events, had accrued 3,075 release points. It was difficult for Amy and me because we did not want to appear to have a favorite; we have become great fans of the owners and captains for both boats. I am sure the pressure was even greater for the respective crews. During the first day of fishing. Caramba caught and released three sailfish while Daymaker had a respectable day releasing two sailfish. Caramba elected to fish on Friday. while Daymaker chose a lay day, perhaps so that they could see what their point total would have to be to catch and pass Caramba to win the Series. Upon returning to the dock empty handed on Friday, I asked Caramba's owner Bob Faith how he felt knowing that Daymaker had one more day to fish. He said that he would rather be in his position as leader than having to play catch up. I believe if it had been me. I would have been wishing for a small craft advisory. Nevertheless, Saturday was no more productive for *Daymaker* than Friday had been for Caramba, and the lead stood. With that, the 2010 Series ended, and while the award for second place is not as nice as that for first, I want to congratulate both captains Dale Lackey (Caramba) and Jay Weaver (Daymaker), as well as the owners Bob Faith and Mark Daniels for an outstanding summer of billfishing. In addition, I would like to extend our congratulations to the owner and captain of Rascal, Norman Pulliam and Mark Rogers, respectively, for winning the 22nd annual Edisto Marina Billfishing Tournament, and to owner Steven Davis and captain Bobby Garmany of the Bench Mark for their win at MEGADOCK.

With the return to five tournaments this summer, we saw a slight drop in the average participation as compared to 2008, when we also had 5 tournaments. During 2008, a total

of 240 boats fished in the Series with 127 individual boats participating. This year the numbers were 207 total and 107 individual boats. The numbers indicate that not as many boats fished multiple tournaments as have in the past. An encouraging trend was that eighteen boats and owners who had not participated in Series events before fished this year. Now we have to figure out how to get the 38 boats back that did not fish with us this year. I am getting tired of saying it, but hopefully the economy will rebound significantly in the coming year. Of course I said

that last year and the year before, but maybe if I say it enough it will come true.

In conclusion, this is also a time for us to thank the Tournament Owners and Coordinators who risk their capital to put on the Series events. The return to Bohicket was exciting with a blue marlin landed and the christening of Reds Ice House. Georgetown Landing was great with Lands End restaurant reopened featuring artwork by Mark Ray, and new marina manager John Horton pulling off his first ever Series event. The CBC with its revised format, under 40 category, and live video feeds from satellite locations and deep reef

fundraising event was a logistical miracle. The MEGADOCK with its air conditioned event tent, fundraising auction, and web updates was well run as usual. And finally, Edisto was the only event which saw participation jump up from recent years, had much faster fuel pumps, saw the Sunset Grill Restaurant re-opened and saw the town run out of ice and gas on Saturday thanks to the influx of folks for the Series. And lastly, we would like to thank whatever power that gave us 15 days of fishing without a small craft advisory; Amy and I are very thankful for that.



3rd ROUND RESULTS 2010 SC GOVERNOR'S CUP BILLFISHING SERIES — CAROLINA BILLFISH CLASSIC

The third tournament in the 22nd season of the South Carolina Governor's Cup Billfishing Series took place over the weekend of June 23-26, 2010, with forty-nine boats participating in the first annual Carolina Billfish Classic. Boats fished out of three ports along the SC coast; the primary venue was the Charleston Harbor Resort and Marina in Mt. Pleasant, with two satellite marinas at Harbor Town Marina on Hilton Head Island and Georgetown Landing Marina in Georgetown.

Wallace Jenkins, Series Program Director for the S.C. Department of Natural Resources (DNR), said, "We had three excellent days of fishing and were very excited to see the concept of multiple ports fishing simultaneously come to fruition. The billfish bite was good, with 47 billfish caught and released during the tournament, 44 sailfish, 2 blue marlin, and 1 white marlin. The Carolina Billfish Classic hosted their event at the Charleston Harbor Resort and Marina. The hotel has hosted other Series events in the past and is considered to be one of the finest venues in the Series. The hospitality of the hotel, marina and the Tournament organizing committee resulted in a wonderful event."

Points for Governor's Cup tournaments are awarded as follows: 600 points for a released blue marlin, 300 points for a released white marlin, and 200 points for a released sailfish. In addition, boats are awarded 25 participation points for each Series tournament entered up to a maximum of three events.



The tournament's Outstanding Billfish Boat and the Outstanding Billfish Conservationist were awarded to *Caramba*, owned by Robert Faith of Mt. Pleasant and captained by Dale Lackey. Going into the last hour of fishing on the final day of the tournament, *Caramba* was in fifth place but catapulted into first based on the catch and release of a blue marlin in the final minutes of fishing on Saturday. *Caramba* finished the tournament with 1,600 points for the release of the blue marlin and 5 sailfish during 2 days of fishing.

Daymaker, owned by Mark Daniels of Greenville and captained by Jay Weaver, came in second with a total of 1,500 points for releasing 6 sailfish and one white marlin. Having fished on Thursday and Friday, Daymaker was fished out on Saturday and heard the news of losing their lead over the radio while tied to the dock.

Game On, owned by Sea Hunt Boats (Victor "Bubba" Roof), of Lexington, SC, and captained by Trey McMillan, came in third by earning 1,000 points for the catch and release of 5 sailfish.

For the third time in as many tournaments, *Petrel*, owned by Harry Johnson of Mt. Pleasant, SC, and captained by Thomas Wynne, was the Blue Water Conservation winner with the tag and release of 3 dolphin over the course of the tournament.

Rascal, owned by Norman Pulliam of Spartanburg and captained by Mark Rogers, earned honors for the Outstanding Dolphin for the 62.4-pound fish caught by Anne Brady Moore Carlson.

Fat Boy took the Outstanding Tuna award. The boat is owned and captained by Allen Hall. Angler Monty Montgomery landed a 12.2-pound blackfin tuna to take the prize.

The Outstanding Wahoo award was earned by *Chaos*, owned and captained by Matthew Watson. Angler Matt Watson caught a 52.4-pound wahoo.

Kelli Ann Roof of Lexington, SC, earned top honors as Outstanding Female Angler for the release of two sailfish aboard *Game On*. Outstanding Youth Angler was awarded to Dylan Wallace, age 15. Wallace was fishing aboard *Scout 34*, owned by Steve Potts, and caught a 12.0-pound dolphin.



MEGADOCK" BILLFISH TOURNAMENT COMES OFF WITHOUT A HITCH



The fourth stop of the 22nd SC Governor's Cup Billfishing Series was blessed with three days of excellent fishing. The HMY/Viking MEGADOCK Billfishing Tournament was held at the Charleston City Marina on July 8-10, and vielded more billfish releases during the course of the three-day tournament than was witnessed thus far this year. With 62 boats participating and fishing two days each, 81 billfish were released. As in recent history, the majority of the catch was comprised of sailfish, with a total of 64 released. Three white marlin were also caught and released during the tournament. "The interesting thing is that for the first time in years, a large number of blue marlin were encountered, with 14 actually being caught and released. This is more than the total number of blue's that have been caught this year in the three previous tournaments combined. Further, in recent years, July has been a slow month

for encountering blue marlin," said SCDNR biologist Wallace Jenkins. He added that, "The reason for the surge is unknown."

The crew of the *Bench Mark* won top honors in the tournament by earning 1,600 points to win the Outstanding Billfish Boat award, with the release of five sailfish and one blue marlin. Steven Davis of Greenwood, SC, owns the *Bench Mark*, which is captained by Bobby Garmany. The boat was also recognized and awarded the Outstanding Billfish Conservationist for the 6 billfish releases.

Second place honors for Outstanding Billfish Boat went to *Reel Passion*, owned by William Ingram and captained by Gary Richardson, which finished with 1,400 points for the release of two blue marlin and one sailfish. *Secotan*, owned by Paul Spencer and captained by Daniel Spencer, finished third with 1,200 points for releasing three sailfish and one blue marlin.


Angler Ryan Higgins aboard Miss Magnolia, owned and captained by Tram Colket, won the Outstanding Dolphin award for his 50.6-pound catch.

The Outstanding Tuna was awarded to angler James Lucas for his catch of a 12.2-pound black fin tuna aboard *Gusto IV*, owned by Gusto III Charters Inc. and captained by Tim Scalise.

The Outstanding Wahoo award was won with a catch of a 42.0-pound fish by Carter Smith aboard *Mindset*, owned by Robert Goff and captained by Lee Conner.

First place for Outstanding Lady Angler went to Kara Slick for the release of one sailfish aboard *Rock N' Reel*, owned by Allen Bell and captained by Chris Bell.

The first place Outstanding Youth Angler was Taylor "Smacky" Wood who caught a 6.4-pound dolphin aboard *Emily Bliss*, owned by Michael Chukusky and captained by Abe Kuhn.

EDISTO MARINA ROUNDS OUT A GREAT SUMMER FOR THE SOUTH CAROLINA GOVERNOR'S CUP BILLFISHNG SERIES

The final chapter of the 22nd SC Governor's Cup Billfishing Series was completed the last weekend of July during an end of summer "Beach Blast" on Edisto Beach. This year, the Edisto Marina Billfish Tournament returned to the end of the Series schedule, July 28-31. When the Series was initiated, the Edisto Marina Tournament was the last event. Over time, with encouragement from the Town of Edisto, it started being held in mid May before the peak of the vacation season. During the intervening years, finding suitable weather days for fishing became problematic, and as a result the tournament requested to be moved back to its traditional mid-summer dates. As hoped, the weather for this year's event was excellent, and there were three beautiful days for fishing. In addition, 29 boats participated in the tournament and 41 billfish were caught and released, including 40 Sailfish and 1 Blue Marlin. "The atmosphere was exciting as the Town of Edisto and the Marina welcomed the fleet and because two boats, Caramba and Daymaker came into this final event only 200 points apart in series standings," said SCDNR biologist and Program Coordinator Wallace lenkins.

The crew of *Rascal* won top honors in the tournament by earning 800 release points to win the Outstanding Billfish Boat award, with the release of four sailfish. Norman Pulliam of Spartanburg,

SC, owns the vessel which is captained by Mark Rogers. *Rascal* was also recognized and awarded the Outstanding Billfish Conservationist for the four billfish releases.

Second place honors for Outstanding Billfish Boat went to *Game On*, owned by Victor "Bubba" Roof of Lexington, SC, and captained by Trey McMillan, which also finished with 800 points for four sailfish releases, but was beaten on time by *Rascal. Lil Bit*, owned and captained by Peter Loy of Mt. Pleasant, SC, finished third with 600 points for releasing one blue marlin.

Angler Peyton Stilp aboard *Trick'em*, owned by Curtis Whitaker and Robert William and captained by Jeff Carter, won the Outstanding Dolphin award for his 35.4-pound catch.

The Outstanding Tuna was awarded to angler Cage Blue for his catch of a 15.6-pound blackfin tuna aboard *Fat Boy*, owned by Allen and Kathy Hall and captained by Allen Hall.

The Outstanding Wahoo award was won with a catch of a 44.2-pound fish by

First place for Outstanding Lady Angler went to Edisto native Linda Lawley aboard *Full Strut*, owned and captained by Greg Roumillat, for her sailfish release.

The first place Outstanding Youth Angler was David Aimar, 15, aboard *Split Bill*, owned by Charlie Aimar and Charlie Rivers, captained by Charlie Aimar. It should be noted that David's sailfish release makes the

first billfish released by a youth since the SC Governor's Cup Tournament Guidelines returned to follow IGFA Rules, which requires the angler to strike and reel the fish with no assistance.

When the dust settled after the three days of fishing, *Caramba* had maintained and extended its Series lead by another 200 points, finishing the Series in first place with 3,875 points for billfish releases. *Daymaker* and *Game On* finished in second and third with 3,475 and 3,275 points, respectively.


