Series Reflections

Well, in the blink of an eye, another fishing season has passed. The oppressive heat during July was hard on us old folks but we survived. On the final day of Megadock I logged 19,513 steps for an estimated distance of 9.4 miles. Now I am starting to realize why my predecessor, Tom Dupre, called it quits back in 2007. I am told that sea conditions during the last two Series events were more like fishing on a hot pond as opposed to the rough and tumble conditions encountered at that tournament to our north in mid-June. While the seas may have been calm, the billfish bite was electric at both Megadock and Edisto. The 71 sailfish released at Megadock resulted in a whopping 2.63 sailfish per boat catch rate which eclipsed the previous high from 2009 which had a 1.86 sailfish per boat catch rate. The tournament's winning boat, Hammer Time owned by Steve Mozelev and captained by Austin Eubank, released a total of 10 sailfish. with 8 occurring in one day. There were also many reports of hooked and lost fish, with one captain telling me they had 9 hookups but were only able to get 2 billfish to the boat for a successful release. It was good to see the sailfish back in large numbers for the first time in several years. The story at Edisto was equally encouraging, with 27 boats releasing 16 blue marlin, an almost unprecedented number for this species, given how late in the season it was, and with water temperatures in the upper 80's. Of equal importance was that many of these fish were estimated to be in the 400 lb + size category. Perhaps the best news we received all summer was that the NOAA ship Pisces deployed their ROV at the Memorial Reef barges that were deployed two years ago and scientist Stacey Harter reported, "The most exciting news I have to share is regarding the two barges in the artificial reef. We dove on them two years ago right after they had been sunk and they essentially had no fish on them at the time, except for a school of amberjack. On barge 1, the shallower one, we observed several scamp, a large red snapper, a small yellowedge grouper, and numerous lionfish. On Barge 2, the deeper one, we observed

lionfish, several scamp, numerous large and juvenile snowy grouper, several warsaw grouper (the most we've ever seen in one area), a couple of small yellowedge grouper, and a small misty grouper. I have been analyzing ROV dives for about 14 years and this was the first misty grouper I have observed. I was ecstatic to say the least."

The importance of this observation cannot be overstated, as it has the potential to greatly affect the direction of the movement to close natural live bottom areas to fishing by designating them as Marine Protected Areas. In addition, at Edisto, I learned from several captains that the Memorial Reef was also the area where most of the billfish that were released during the tournament were captured. So it appears that the reefs are doing exactly what they were intended to do: providing habitat, and serving as spawning areas for imperiled deep water groupers, while attracting bait and pelagic species including billfish, much to the delight of SC anglers. The many volunteers that initiated the efforts to fund, build and deploy the SC Memorial Reef, and businesses like Stevens Towing, who were so crucial to the completion of this project, are to be commended.

And last but certainly not least, owners Graham and Manly Eubank, Captain Bobby Garmany and the crew of the Sportin' Life are to be congratulated for finishing as the top boat with 3,875 points. While they did not win any of the individual tournaments this summer, they were competitive at each event, and were able to edge out the second place boat Electric Bill, owned by Chad Sanders and captained by Phillip Fender, based on release time. Third place went to Rascal, the 2015 Series winner, owned by Norman Pulliam and Foster McKissick and captained by Mark Rogers, with 3,675 points. Here comes The Judge!
