The season started off with a bang at Bohicket with 43 boats, and concluded with Nick Macpherson throwing in a game changing decision at the 11<sup>th</sup> hour by rolling nearly \$70,000 in registration fees into the tournament awards. At Georgetown, we had the highest participation we've seen in a while, with 58 boats. Fishing was good and the landbased activities were over the top. The handcarved tournament awards made by the same individual who makes the Series Awards, Chris Costello, were and continue to be a highlight. Then, after a three week hiatus, we rolled into the Charleston Harbor Resort and Marina well rested and ready for the Carolina Billfish Classic. Fifty-five boats participated, and with most of them on B dock, it made for a great atmosphere. During the break, fishing had flipped from a dominance of blue marlin to sailfish as compared to the first two tournaments. As this newsletter is published, we are preparing for back-to-back Megadock and Edisto tournaments, and in just two short (long) weeks, the 30<sup>th</sup> season will be in the history books.

Reflecting back over the Series history, we often think of the winners, all the great sponsors, and of course, Governor Campbell for getting the concept off the ground and widely accepted. But none of this would have happened without significant input from the Wildlife Department/DNR staff. Going way back into the late 1970's, staff, primarily Don Hammond, started attending blue water tournaments and collecting data on catch per unit effort of billfish and other species using much of the same approach as we use today, over 40 years later. I don't know for sure, but I imagine these data were used by him and others to convince policy makers that something needed to be done to change the catch and kill nature of these events to something more conservation minded. In 1989, the Series was established, providing incentives for releasing billfish and meatfish. As part of this program, an annual reporting requirement was created. Reading through these 30 years of reports, I've noticed that one thing is typically missing: acknowledgement of those individuals who stood on the docks, rain or shine, to collect the important fishery

data that is essential for managing these recreationally important species. So, in an effort to rectify that, I am going to list the names of individuals who contributed by decade. You, the reader, may remember some of them, and while others may have only been around for a few years, they are all important. Of course, Don was the program leader from 1989 until 1999. In 2000, Wayne Waltz took over until his retirement from DNR in 2005. Then in 2005, Tom Dupré, who actually started assisting Don and Kay Davy in the 1993 season and holds the record for longest tenure (15 years), was the program leader for 3 seasons ending in 2007. During those years, they had a number of folks who helped out. In the 1990's, the list includes Shelly Knight, Barclay McCurdy, Kim Iverson, Dean Cain, Kristen Lennox and Michele Cunningham. In the early 2000's, there was my late wife Nan Jenkins, Kris Reynolds, Brent Merritt and Lyndsay Roberg. Amy Dukes started volunteering in 2001 and was the logical choice to replace Tom beginning with the 2008 season. I was brought on for adult supervision. Since then, Amy and I have had three standout employees to help us, including Elizabeth Miller, Jesse Alderson, and now Kayla Rudnay. Each

of these individuals is responsible for the present day relevance and success of the Series, and should be remembered and thanked for their dedication and service. Until next time; safe travels.
