Series Reflections

It's hard to believe that with two tournaments completed, we are technically half way through the 2019 SC Governor's Cup Season. Things have gone smoothly for the most part from a management perspective, with the only major hiccup being what does a legal SC Saltwater fishing license (which you must have in your possession) while fishing, look like? At Bohicket, we encountered for the first time ever documents that could be printed from the SCDNR website listing privileges, which it was subsequently determined were not valid for use as a substitute for a license. This lead to staff having to print out flyers and a poster board with examples of what was legal and what was not to hand out at the Captains' meeting in Georgetown. Hopefully this issue is behind us as we get ready for the CBC beginning June 19 followed by Edisto on July 17. We had a good turnout at Bohicket with 33 boats and Georgetown with 56. One highlight for me at least at Georgetown, other than the bacon wrapped scallops, was that on the last day of fishing, the affable crew of the Christy II caught and released a blue marlin with veteran angler Poe Ratterree on the rod. As many of you know, these guys usually (and very successfully) target meatfish. This is the first time I can remember that they caught a billfish. Congratulations couldn't have been in order for a nicer bunch of guys; if they had caught it a little earlier, they might have finished in the money! On another note, we've been close to breaking 60 boats for the first time in many years at a tournament, lastminute mechanical problems and other issues seem to always curtail the participant list. Hopefully, the CBC

will break that barrier in a couple of weeks; they certainly have the space available, so sign up! In addition, I'm told that as promised, additional dock space at Edisto and other improvements including electrical and fueling systems have been completed. We are looking forward to having more boats actually in the marina.

Finally, while tournament logistics have been good, most of the talk on the docks has been related to the paucity of billfish in the catch. I looked back at our catch per boat by species data going back to 2000, and the numbers (particularly for blue marlin) are the lowest we have seen since 2011. This is not necessarily cause for concern, since between 2000 and 2010 the catch rates we are currently seeing for blue marlin would have been the norm, and this may just be an anomalous year for a variety of reasons (e.g. recent prevailing wind direction, moon phase, water temps, etc.). To put things in perspective, after the first two tournaments in 2018, we had

landed or released three times as many blue marlin per boat than we have encountered this year. The catch of white marlin over the years has been highly variable but it appears, at present, we are slightly above the long-term average and are doing nearly twice as well as this time last year. Sailfish numbers in the first two tournaments are way below the long term average, but this is not unexpected as their numbers in the catch typically increase as the season progresses. I imagine trolling all day

offshore and not catching anything can be tedious and frustrating. That said, it is our hope that things turn around and we have nonstop excitement going forward. We hope to see all of you in a couple of weeks; in the meantime, keep your eyes on what's happening at Big Rock the week of June 10-15. Hopefully some SC boats can get on and stay on the leader board. If that happens, who knows, you might see us at the awards ceremony on Saturday night!







