## Series Reflections:

A lot has happened since our last newsletter in April. First, the Governor's Cup Advisory Board met prior to the Georgetown Blue Marlin Tournament Captain's meeting in May to deliberate on how to move forward with the SC Memorial Reef Project after negotiations for the purchase and deployment of the Highway 21 Bridge were terminated in April due to available material and cost considerations. By happenstance, another optimal alternative more became available shortly thereafter in the form of a 247-foot-long, 71-foot-tall cargo ship named the *Coastal Venture*. At the meeting, the Advisory Board agreed to move forward with this project which is infinitely more desirable than the partial swing bridge superstructure

on a barge concept. The vessel has a double hull made from heavier gauge steel plate than typically found in a barge, the fuel has already been removed and hull paint is lead free, plus, very little if any asbestos is on board. All these features combined make it easier to prepare for sinking as well as quite durable with a very long life expectancy (100s of years) on the bottom. Finally, the windlass and sufficient anchor chain are present to allow the ship to be anchored and stay in the designated location during the sinking process. In conclusion, the Advisory Board voted to set an all-in fund-raising goal of \$500,000. I am very excited about this project and have already donated \$5,000 myself, because it will be a great addition to the Charleston Deep Reef MPA due to the complexity of the internal structure which will make excellent spawning and juvenile habitat for imperiled deep-water species like Warsaw, Misty and Snowy Grouper. Plus, the vessel's sheer size will create significant upwelling to attract bait communities and pelagic fish. Details and photos of the vessel, as well as information on how you can contribute can be found later in the newsletter.

Now to briefly recap our return to normal and the two tournaments that have been held to date. Georgetown was a huge success with 65 boats participating in the two fish days before getting blown out on Saturday by a small craft To top it off the fishing was advisory. unbelievable with the greatest catch per unit effort for blue marlin than has ever been recorded in SC tournament history, with one blue marlin also being landed. Plus, for the first time in my 14 years with the Series, a yellowfin tuna was weighed. Both statistics are encouraging, and I am taking them as a sign that after years of US scientists' work at ICCAT, things are finally starting to turn around for these and other pelagic species. The landside activities at Georgetown were back to pre-Covid conditions and if anyone went home hungry or thirsty it was their own fault. As usual the appetizers just kept on coming and the marina staff did an amazing job. The tournament concluded on Saturday night with a very emotional ceremony where many of those we lost in the past year were memorialized. There was not a dry eye in the house. The highlight for me was getting to speak to Jim Shannon's wife, Leigh, and his sons, as well as a very

emotional conversation with Mark Daniels' son, Robert, who was on hand to present a new Georgetown tourney award in his father's honor to Captain Mike Glaesner.

In June, the CBC also went off without a hitch, although participation was somewhat lower than hoped for due to uncertainty related to weather. Thursday ended up being a lay day for every boat. This however had a silver lining because the owners, captains, crews and families got to fully enjoy all the amenities the Charleston Harbor Resort and Marina has to offer; they also had the chance to catch up after not seeing many of these folks in person for much of last The fishing was not comparable to year. Georgetown, but GLAZED was able to collect 1000 release points and win over the secondplace boat BLUE SKY on the narrowest of time margins. The awards ceremony was bittersweet, as I was able to acknowledge the 21 years of participation by Ed Holder on all three advisory committees of the Marine Division including the Marine Advisory Committee, the Saltwater License Advisory Board and 6 years on the Governor's Cup Billfishing Series Advisory Board, with several as Chairman. It is my understanding that Ed is the only person in history to have done this. He also holds the record for the longest tenure. The bad news is we won't have Ed's levelheaded council at these meetings going forward, but I am sure we know how to reach him if we need him. Finally, I learned that this was Deidre Menefee's last year as CBC Tournament Director. It seems like I have known Deidre since we were children, but in reality, she is much younger than me. Over the years, Deidre has always been a big supporter of the Series while at the same time hosting quality events. Just like in Ed's case, I am sorry to be losing her but again we know where she lives. I look forward to seeing you all at Edisto later this month. It will be my last tournament. Ironically, it was my first tournament back in May 2008, so it will be fitting to close out this run at the ancestorial home of many generations of Jenkins.

## **Current Project: M/V** Coastal Venture




The newest SC Memorial Reef project includes plans to sink the 247-ft M/V *Coastal Venture* in the Charleston Deep Reef MPA. The vessel (70-ft keel to top of the mast) will provide habitat for a diversity of species. Its complex structure will offer refuge for finfish and other marine organisms, as well as provide areas on which invertebrates can settle and grow. Additionally, the upwelling that will result from such a large structure will release nutrients into the water column and increase the overall productivity of the area.

### Fundraising goal: \$500,000

If we can raise the funds by Summer 2022, we will transport and sink the M/V *Coastal Venture*. We plan to deploy the vessel in 350 feet of water about a mile south of the sunken Highway 41 bridge.
