## Series Reflections:

Well now that the Series tournament season is over, I have to say it was a good way to cap off my 45-year career with DNR. Way back in 1975, I had the good fortune to be hired as a summer intern at the Marine Resources Research Institute, and up to that point, it was the best day of my life. I worked in the field with the lab director Dr. Vic Burrell, sampling each of the state's estuaries and monitoring oyster spawning along the coast. I thank Drs. Paul Sandifer and Ted Smith for giving me my first full time biologist job in 1978, working on freshwater shrimp culture. I have never left since, successively rising to a Bio II then III, then IV, and by 1994, working on a series of grant funded projects on sturgeon, striped bass, red drum, southern flounder, and cobia. I eventually became the lead biologist on the stocking research efforts for the Marine Resources Division for red drum, striped bass, and cobia. From the start, Paul and Ted gave me the opportunity to travel all over the

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world, meeting and working with the leaders in aquaculture research, many of whom became personal friends that I still communicate with to this day. I was gone in the field, during this time, perhaps 150 days a year. Then it all came crashing down in 2006, with my wife Nan's diagnosis of pancreatic cancer, to which she succumbed in May 2007. I had some decisions to make. With two young children at home and over 30 years in the state system, I contemplated retirement.

Then Robert Boyles extended an opportunity that literally saved me when he asked if I would be willing to take over a leadership role with the SC Governor's Cup Billfishing Series and move from the Research Institute to the Office of Fisheries Management. He said that it was due to my experience and people skills accumulated during the many years of working with colleagues within the agency, the nation, and the world. I discussed it with the kids, and they told me to ask for a raise. The only other request I had was that Amy Dukes, a biologist who worked in the ACE Basin and volunteered with the Series for five years, come on as my assistant. The rest is history, and these last 14 seasons have been perhaps the most rewarding in my professional career, primarily because of you, the passionate fishermen and women, who are part of the Governor's Cup family. But also, because of what we have been able to accomplish together at the national and international level, by having a place on the



Highly Migratory Species Advisory Panel for National Marine Fisheries Service and participating in the International Convention for the Conservation of Atlantic Tunas, a 50-member international group that allocates harvest of billfish, sharks and tunas in the north and south Atlantic Basin. In 2012, working at the national level with recreational anglers, the SC Governor's Cup lent support to convince

Congress to do what the SC legislature had already done in SC, which was prohibit the sale of all marlin, sailfish, and spearfish in the continental US. This effectively eliminated an estimated 30,000 billfish harvested and imported each year, primarily for pet food, from foreign countries. Here at the state level, we have also been part of a succession of projects started by Governor's Cup participants in 2008 to place material in the Charleston Deep Reef MPA, which continues to this day with the current plan to sink the 247-foot-long ship, [Coastal Venture](#), in this 4 X 6-nautical-mile permitted area, known as the [SC Memorial Reef](#). These are still, to my knowledge, the only artificial reefs deployed in over 300 feet of water for the express purpose of enhancing deep water grouper spawning and nursery habitat instead of closing additional areas of live bottom to recreational anglers, and we get the side benefit of excellent fishing for pelagic species. This work has recently been described and acknowledged to be very successful in the scientific literature. This is an accomplishment of which I am very proud and will hopefully advance future construction of deep-water artificial reef MPAs throughout the nation. We also, after a 12-year quest on my part, were able to complete the analysis of the PSAT tagging data on blue marlin, white marlin, and sailfish, facilitated by Governor's Cup participants from 2005-2007, and get this important billfish movement and habitat preference information published in 2020, thanks to the efforts of Dr. Wally Bubley. Now it is available to science in perpetuity instead of sitting in a file cabinet for no one to see. I owe him big time. Of course, none of this would have been possible without the support of all the Governor's Cup Advisory Board members with



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each successive Chairman and the individuals on the Tournament Committee. In addition, we owe a huge thank you to our many faithful sponsors and donors who have provided the financial resources to operate the program but also the extra funds to undertake these massive capital-intensive projects. I especially want to thank Jim Reed with Western Branch Diesel (formerly Superior Diesel Incorporated) and Volvo Penta, who back in 2012 made a commitment to be a Corporate Sponsor for ten years, donating a total of \$100,000 to the Series. Finally, I want to thank the DNR staff who have worked hard along the way to make the Series a success, especially Amy and Officer Willie Ladue, who have been with me for my entire tenure. I will miss all of you as I move into this next phase of my life and again, I am grateful for the many friendships and the great people I have come to know. What each of you do to spread our conservation message is important to the state, nation, and world.

Amy Dukes will be taking over leadership of the program and I ask you to give her the same level of support you gave me. Who knows, the bacon wrapped scallops may lure me back to Georgetown next May? Goodbye and I hope to see you on the docks.

# THE SC MEMORIAL REEF



## Current Project: M/V *Coastal Venture*




The newest SC Memorial Reef project includes plans to sink the 247-ft M/V *Coastal Venture* in the Charleston Deep Reef MPA. The vessel (70-ft keel to top of the mast) will provide habitat for a diversity of species. Its complex structure will offer refuge for finfish and other marine organisms, as well as provide areas on which invertebrates can settle and grow. Additionally, the upwelling that will result from such a large structure will release nutrients into the water column and increase the overall productivity of the area.

### Fundraising goal: \$500,000

If we can raise the funds by Summer 2022, we will transport and sink the M/V *Coastal Venture*. We plan to deploy the vessel in 350 feet of water about a mile south of the sunken Highway 41 bridge.




